Re: NEW SURVEY RESULTS: Kansans support efforts to make voting easier for all eligible

citizens

A new poll conducted by Global Strategy Group on behalf of the ACLU of Kansas finds that Kansas voters across party lines are concerned about politicians trying to undermine the votes of American citizens and want their leaders to prioritize protecting democracy. They support elected officials taking steps to make voting easier for <u>all</u> eligible citizens, including those who speak a language other than English. The memo below further details key findings from this research.

Key Findings

- Kansans recognize current threats to democracy and want their elected officials to step in. Politicians trying to undermine the votes of American citizens is seen as the biggest problem in our electoral process today by far (70% major problem), with 88% of Democrats and 60% of non-Democrats agreeing. With this in mind, 71% of voters, including 93% of Democrats and 59% of non-Democrats, say that protecting democracy should be a top priority for elected officials.
- While election integrity is important to voters, few are concerned about claims of widespread voter fraud. 70% say protecting the integrity of our elections should be a top priority, including 67% of Democrats and 72% of non-Democrats. This does not mean, however, that "voter fraud" is a pressing issue in voters' minds. In fact, 52% say voter fraud is not a significant problem in Kansas, and only 13% believe there has been widespread voter fraud in recent elections, including just 17% of Republicans.
- Kansans support efforts to make voting easier for those who use a language other than English. 56% of voters support these efforts, which include providing voters with ballots and other election materials in the language they are most comfortable using and ensuring eligible citizens are informed of their right to these materials. Vast majorities of Democrats (91%) and independents (68%) are supportive, along with two-thirds of voters in Johnson County. Even in the face of opponents' arguments, support for these efforts does not dip below 50%.

ABOUT THE POLL

Global Strategy Group conducted a survey of 600 registered voters in Kansas between September 18th – September 23rd, 2025. Responses were collected using a mix of live phone and text-to-web interviewing. The survey has a margin of error of +/- 4.0% overall. Care has been taken to ensure the geographic, political, and demographic divisions of the population of registered voters are properly represented.
